What ALPR isn't

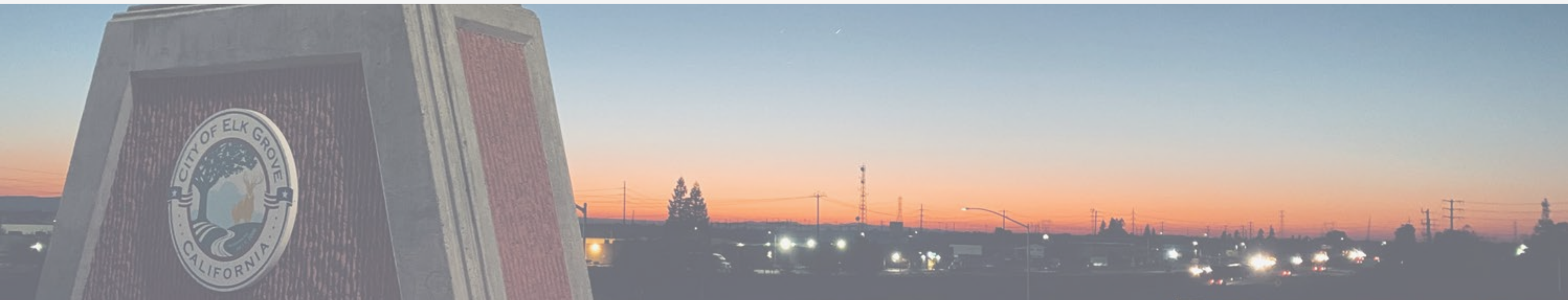


ALPR does not identify people, perform facial recognition, or conduct real time surveillance of any person or vehicle.

From March 2021 to present day

Flock Vehicle Alerts → 1,548

Of these alerts, 866 have resulted in an arrest → 56%

Comprehensive Totals

Calls for Service → 5,293

Of these CFS, 700 have resulted in an arrest → 13%

The Wins

Report 26 - 000890 | Fatal Hit - and - Run (02/03/2026)

- Collision on Bruceville Rd., south of Boa Nova Way resulted in one fatality
- Victim struck while standing near the roadway by a southbound vehicle
- RTIC leveraged fixed traffic cameras and FLOCK to identify a vehicle of interest
- Investigative follow - up on registered owner and vehicle location led to an arrest

Report 25- 002371 | Missing Juvenile Recovery (04/13/2025)

- Elk Grove PD assisted Kern County SO with an at -risk missing 10-year-old
- Juvenile located safely within Elk Grove; adult male suspect taken into custody
- RTIC provided FLOCK and traffic camera data locating an image from the suspect vehicle's which provided an investigative needed to narrow down potential locations.

Report 24- 5467 | Burglary (09/01/2024)

A Flock alert was received for a vehicle related to a burglary at a Mosque. RTIC located the vehicle pulled over prior to entering the freeway. The vehicle made an illegal U -turn and pulled into a gas station. RTIC monitored the gas station parking lot exits until patrol arrived on scene and arrested the suspect.
