**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE
APPROVING THE FY2025 CITYWIDE CRACK SEAL PROJECT (MP2501);
AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONSTRUCTION
CONTRACT WITH PAVEMENT REHAB COMPANY FOR THE PROJECT IN THE
AMOUNT OF \$748,230; AUTHORIZING THE CITY ENGINEER TO APPROVE
CHANGE ORDERS NOT TO EXCEED \$74,823; AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY
MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT WITH THE SECOND
LOWEST RESPONSIVE BIDDER IF THE FIRST LOWEST RESPONSIVE BIDDER
DOES NOT MEET FILING OBLIGATIONS
(CEQA EXEMPT)**

WHEREAS, the FY2025 Citywide Crack Seal Project (MP2501) (Project) includes placement of crack seal treatment on over 1.5 million square yards of various streets throughout the City of Elk Grove (City) (Work); and

WHEREAS, an invitation to bid was duly advertised on January 3, 2025, and January 10, 2025, and electronic bids were received on January 30, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Pavement Rehab Company was determined to be the responsible bidder submitting the lowest responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, Global Road Sealing, Inc. was determined to be the responsible bidder submitting the second lowest responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, the Project is a project under California Environmental Quality Act (Section 21000 et seq. of the Public Resources Code, hereinafter referred to as CEQA), which requires that cities consider the environmental consequences of their actions before approving a project; and

WHEREAS, the Project is included in the approved Fiscal Year 2024-25 Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby:

- 1) Finds the FY2025 Citywide Crack Seal Project (MP2501) exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15301 (existing facilities) of the State CEQA Guidelines based upon the following finding:

Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) of the State CEQA Guidelines (Chapter 3 of Division 6 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations) provides an exemption from CEQA for projects involving the minor alteration of existing public or private facilities when the alteration involves negligible or no expansion of an existing use. The Project involves repairing pavement along existing streets throughout the City. As the proposed improvements will occur to existing City-owned public infrastructure and right-of-way and will not result in an expansion of use, the Project qualifies for the identified exemption and no additional environmental review under CEQA is required; and

- 2) Approves the Project; and
- 3) Authorizes the City Manager to execute a construction contract with Pavement Rehab Company for the FY2025 Citywide Crack Seal Project (MP2501) in the amount of \$748,230 upon receipt of all required bonds and insurance and the approval of such bonds and insurance by the City Attorney; and
- 4) Authorizes the City Engineer to approve change orders not to exceed \$74,823; and
- 5) Authorizes the City Manager to execute a construction contract with the second lowest responsive bidder, Global Road Sealing, Inc., if Pavement Rehab Company does not meet filing obligations.
