3.0 APPROVAL OF PAST MEETING MINUTES

April 2025 minutes: Ann moved to approve, Ted seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

4.0 REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS/POSSIBLE RECOMMENDATIONS

4.1 5 Year Capital Improvement Plan

Christina Castro said the plan was adopted by Council on June 11, 2025. This goes to Council each year with the first year of the plan being in the new fiscal year's budget. She said 8 projects were completed in the current year. Next year includes 90 different projects in 5 different categories. The 5 year budget is approximately \$293 million. \$180 million is funded so far. \$122 million accounts for transportation projects. Council identifies priority projects each year. There are 9 this year; 5 are actively in construction and 4 are moving into construction. Ted asked how pedestrian signals are prioritized. Christina said data is used to determine that, with pedestrian count being the most important. Steve asked if that's the most effective way to make that determination. Christina also said that other things are considered including resident calls and requests. Steve mentioned that crossing side streets is becoming more difficult with increased traffic. Christina said the City is working with a consultant regarding signal timing, etc. Steve asked if there's a maximum number of backed up cars that would trigger a signal change. Christina explained that there's methodologies to make traffic the most efficient, but that the traffic engineers are the experts on that. She moved on to the Library saying it's targeted for finish in Spring/Summer next year. This year they're adding a project to improve Laguna Blvd, which includes curb ramps. Total ramps this year will total 118 ramps. Curb ramp improvements generally precede roadway improvements. Val asked about roadway fees levied on business for new roads, and asked about existing business contributions towards roadway maintenance. Christina said the fees brings everyone together to pay for new development and growth. Existing roadways cannot use roadway fees. A new sign for the Grant Line Business Park will be placed near the Kubota factory. A new trail is being built to the south of EG Creek on Laguna Springs Dr. Also a new one on the West side of Bruceville between Sheldon and Big Horn. Christina stated the Elk Grove Blvd Streetscape Project will be two lane but will have a shared left turn lane in the middle. The first step is putting all the utilities underground. Christina described the proposed Laguna Creek Hwy 99 pedestrian overcrossing that has \$10.5 million in grant funding. Construction could start early 2027. She moved onto the Laguna Creek Waterman undercrossing. She described several more projects.

The committee by consensus continued this discussion to the next appropriate meeting.
