

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-086

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE
DISPENSING WITH THE FORMAL BIDDING PROCEDURE PURSUANT TO ELK
GROVE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 3.42.180(B)(3) AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY
MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH R.C.A. INVESTMENTS, INC., A
CALIFORNIA CORPORATION, FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO REPLACEMENT
AND TWO NEW BMW RT-P PURSUIT-RATED POLICE MOTORCYCLES IN AN
AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$212,334.20**

WHEREAS, the City of Elk Grove's Fleet Services Division maintains City vehicles and coordinates the replacement and acquisition of vehicles in support of operational needs; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has identified the need to replace two existing motorcycles that were damaged and determined to be total losses, and to purchase two additional motorcycles to enhance operational capabilities, including traffic enforcement and response in congested areas; and

WHEREAS, the City has an established fleet of BMW pursuit-rated police motorcycles, and maintaining a standardized fleet provides operational efficiencies in training, maintenance, parts inventory, and lifecycle management; and

WHEREAS, R.C.A. Investments, Inc. (Long Beach BMW) has an established history of providing police motorcycles and specialized upfitting services to the City and has demonstrated the ability to deliver fully integrated units that meet the Police Department's specifications; and

WHEREAS, the specialized nature of police motorcycle upfitting and the City's existing investment in standardized equipment make it advantageous to procure vehicles from a vendor familiar with the City's requirements to ensure compatibility, reduce coordination risks, and minimize downtime; and

WHEREAS, while the newest model of BMW RT-P motorcycle is not currently included in the State of California's competitively bid contract, pricing offered by R.C.A. Investments, Inc. has been evaluated and determined to be consistent with competitive market pricing; and

WHEREAS, current manufacturing and supply chain conditions result in extended lead times for police motorcycles, and timely procurement is necessary to maintain operational readiness; and

WHEREAS, for the reasons presented, a formal bidding process is not in the best interest of the City because it is unlikely to result in a more advantageous outcome given the specialized nature of the equipment, the need for fleet standardization, and the demonstrated capability of the vendor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby:


1. Finds that the formal bidding procedure for the purchase of the subject pursuit-rated police motorcycles is not in the best interest of the City and dispenses with the formal procedure pursuant to Elk Grove Municipal Code Section 3.42.180(B)(3); and
2. Authorizes the City Manager to execute a contract with R.C.A. Investments, Inc., a California corporation, in substantially the form presented, for the purchase of two replacement and two new BMW RT-P pursuit-rated police motorcycles in an amount not to exceed \$212,334.20.
