

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-139

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE DISPENSING WITH THE FORMAL REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL PROCEDURE PURSUANT TO ELK GROVE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 3.42.140(B)(3) AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT WITH THE LAW ENFORCEMENT CHAPLAINCY OF SACRAMENTO TO EXTEND ITS CRISIS RESPONSE SERVICES THROUGH JUNE 30, 2029, WITH AN OPTIONAL THREE-YEAR EXTENSION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$139,398.08 (FOR A TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$199,398.08)

WHEREAS, law enforcement personnel routinely respond to critical incidents involving traumatic injuries, fatalities, violent crimes, and other crisis situations that affect victims, family members, community members, and Police Department personnel; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement chaplains provide a valuable service by assisting officers and professional staff during critical incidents, offering emotional and spiritual support to victims and their families, and helping connect individuals with appropriate community resources; and

WHEREAS, the City of Elk Grove (City) has previously entered into a contract with Law Enforcement Chaplaincy Sacramento (LECS), a nonprofit organization, for the provision of law enforcement chaplaincy and critical incident response services; and


WHEREAS, the City desires to amend the existing contract to continue these specialized services in order to maintain continuity of care, support established response protocols, and ensure timely access to trained chaplaincy resources during critical incidents; and


WHEREAS, for the reasons presented, staff recommends that the City Council dispense with the formal request for proposal procedure pursuant to Elk Grove Municipal Code (EGMC) Section 3.42.140(B)(3) as such a procedure is not in the best interest of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby dispenses with the formal request for proposal procedure pursuant to Elk Grove Municipal Code Section 3.42.140(B)(3) and authorizes the City Manager to execute the First Amendment to the contract with Law Enforcement Chaplaincy Sacramento, in substantially the form presented, for crisis response services through June 30, 2029, with a three-year option to extend, in the amount of \$139,398.08 (for a total contract amount not to exceed \$199,398.08).
