## **COMMISSION SCOPE**

The scope of the City of Elk Grove Diversity Commission will focus around the three tenants of Education/Promotion, being Ambassadors, and providing Council feedback. ### **EDUCATION / PROMOTION**

- Serve as a resource for City government and the community by providing information, education, and communication that facilitates a better understanding and celebrates our differences
- Provide education regarding the community's overall diversity
- Periodically work with City departments to assist with existing events and activities

### **AMBASSADORS**

- Engage the community as Diversity Ambassadors to solicit feedback and information, which in turn, will be provided back to the City
- Assist the City in supporting and working with all areas of government and the community to eliminate and prevent all forms of discrimination, hate or bias

### **COUNCIL FEEDBACK**

- Provide recommendations and information to the City that would identify opportunities to address diversity issues, promote diversity programs, and/or provide guidance to create a more accessible, safe, welcoming and inclusive government and community
- Advise on best practices for conducting outreach to a diverse community
- Make recommendations on new events and activities that are appropriate and relevant for the community
- Evaluate and provide recommendations regarding Sister City applications

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## **City of Elk Grove California**

### **City Code of Ethics**

#### **Preamble**

The City of Elk Grove aspires to create an atmosphere of mutual respect between its government and residents, striving to promote and maintain a culture of strong ethics. Leadership has a duty to residents to provide a responsible, fair and honest city government that operates in an atmosphere of respect and civility. Accordingly, the Elk Grove City Council, with community input, has adopted this Code to:

1. Describe the standards of behavior to which its Elected Officials, Commissioners and staff aspire.
2. Provide an ongoing source of guidance to daily activities and long-term planning in all levels of decision making.
3. Promote and maintain a strong culture of ethics.

#### **Pledge**

On April 9, 2025, the City Council of the City of Elk Grove adopted this City Code of Ethics, which applies to all City employees, officers, commissions, and elected or appointed officials and requires the following pledge:

### **City Code of Ethics**

#### **Responsibility**

- I will serve with dignity and respect on behalf of my fellow residents.
- I strive to make decisions that reflect my best independent judgment as an agent of the democratic process.
- The resources of the city and my office will be used for the sole benefit of its residents.
- I act as a steward of public resources, actively considering the impact of my decisions on the financial and social stability of the city and its residents.

#### **Fairness**

- I promote consistency, equity and non-discrimination in public agency decision making and actions.
- I make decisions on the merits of an issue, including all applicable laws, research, facts, and encourage diverse public engagement in our decision-making processes.
- I support the public's right to information and aspire to bring transparency to the decisions and conduct of the city.

- In my capacity as a city representative, I will treat others with patience, courtesy, civility, and respect.
- I act in a cooperative manner with groups and other individuals, working together in a spirit of tolerance and understanding.
